Guidelines for submission

POETRY or READING

Topic: Focus on the Holocaust experience as retold and remembered

Length: A single poem of 20 – 24 lines or a single reading of 500 words or less

Format: Typed and double spaced

12 point

Title – centered

Individual lines flush left

Name, date, grade, schools, email, phone numbers in top left corner

Assessment criterial: Address issues and topics of the Holocaust

Focus on a single experience, idea or feeling

Use precise sensory words in a fresh interesting way

Standard English grammar

Proper spelling, usage, and writing mechanics

Exhibit poetic devices unobtrusively

Follow contest guidelines
