



SUMMER READING GOES DIGITAL

Beanstack

Participation this year is on our new tracking app: Beanstack. Download the "Beanstack Tracker" app by Zoobean from your smart device's app store. In the app, follow these steps to make an account:

- (1) Answer "Yup" to, Does your school, library or Bookstore already use Beanstack?
- (2) Search for Andover Public Library (KS).
- (3) Click on *Don't Have an Account? Sign Up!* and enter a username and password of your choice.
- (4) Add any readers in your family (each child will need to be added as a reader) and join challenges!

Even if you already use Beanstack with another library, you will need to register again to use it with APL.

Challenges

This year, APL's Summer Reading Program is all digital! There are several options for readers of all ages:

- The *Summer Reading Challenge 2020* is our traditional summer reading challenge with prize books.
- The Elementary Age Summer Reading Activity Challenge 2020 is a fun challenge for elementary aged readers. This challenge asks the participant to complete at least five challenges out of 12 to be automatically entered into a drawing at the end of the summer.
- The Adult Summer Reading Challenge 2020 is a fun activity challenge for adult readers. Adult readers will read at least five books in different categories to be entered into a drawing at the end of the summer.

Our Summer Reading Program runs from June 1st through July 30th. The first badge (ticket) redemption for the *Summer Reading Challenge 2020* is on June 10th. No badges may be redeemed after July 31st.

Our RBdigital catalog includes over 37,000 audiobooks with zero holds! That means many of your favorite titles and bestsellers are always available to you - no waiting required!


Download the RBdigital app via your devices App Store or access the catalog with your preferred web browser to listen online.

However, to upgrade your app with this new release and to use future versions of it, you will need to use iOS 11 or later.

TumbleBookLibrary is an online collection of e-books for children with a catalog of over 250 animated, talking picture books. TumbleBookLibrary also features Spanish and French books, read-along chapter books, non-fiction books, and exciting games and puzzles.

You can use your computer, tablet, or smartphone - all you need is an internet connection. There are no downloads: books are streamed right to your device at the click of a button.



THE HAPPY EVER AFTER PLAYLIST

Two years after the death of her fiance, Sloan Monroe is still struggling to regain a sense of normalcy amidst her grief. The basics of daily life are neglected and friendships are severed. It isn't until she meets the charming Jason Tucker that she begins to understand the mess she has allowed her life to become. Slowly, Jason helps her

move beyond her past and find friendship and love again. But simply moving on isn't as easy as it appears.

In a romantic genre where writing is often propped up by hackneyed and shallow story lines, *The Happy Ever After Playlist* by Abby Jimenez stands apart. In addition to fully crafted characters, her story is a testament to the pain of grief and the struggle to heal. But most importantly, it maintains humor and realistic responses to change without being bogged down in emotional angst. It is the perfect balance between comedy, drama, and romance. Does the book have it's occasional cliche moments? Of course. But then, what romance doesn't?


The Happy Ever After Playlist is highly recommended and can be read either as a standalone or as a sequel companion to Jimenez's *The Friend Zone*.

One of my favorite authors is Mitch Albom. When the coronavirus pandemic started Mitch Albom decided to write a real-time novel about hope. Each week he posted a chapter of the book.



I read an interview where he talked about the process of writing this book. Unlike published books, this book was unedited, there were no rewrites, it was just his words typed out and put online.

The book is about four families that share a single street corner. They have become close over the years and get together each weekend. One family is of Chinese descent and during the book, you see how hard it is for this family as criticism against their heritage arises. There is a doctor and his family. He faces many challenges as this virus progresses and eventually hits him personally. The town preacher struggles when he is notified to shut down his church. Will he follow his faith and put other lives in danger? The fourth family runs the local mill in town. His shelves are empty and supplies are hard to get. He and his wife deal with rude customers and rebellion in his own family. The housekeeper of one family is the mother of a very special little boy named Moses. Why has Moses never been sick? What secret is his mother hiding and why does she think he is the answer to healing the world?


Mitch Albom wrote this book to provide a ray of hope and I believe he did that for me.

GIRL GONE VIRAL

Former model and young widow, Katrina King, craves a low-profile life, but when she meets a cute guy at a coffee shop, she's suddenly viral on Twitter. Desperate to escape before the identity of #CuteCafeGirl is discovered. Katrina's



bodyguard Jas Singh whisks her away to his family's orchard. Will Katrina be able to keep her growing affection for Jas at bay? Will Jas' long-running family dispute get in the way? Will Katrina keep her identity secret?

I settled down with Girl Gone Viral thinking it would be a fluffy, sweet romance with little filler, but was I wrong -- Girl Gone Viral is so much more! This is the second in the Modern Love series by Alisha Rai, and while I haven't read the first book in the series, I don't think that affected my reading of *Girl Gone Viral*.

Both of the main characters struggle with mental health (depression, anxiety, and PTSD), and the discussions of therapy, how to support a friend that needs help, and complex family dynamics were handled well and with compassion. It's not often that I find a fiction book that addresses mental health in such an everyday, commonplace way. I'm encouraged to see the beginnings of the normalization of mental health and therapy in contemporary fiction.

The pacing of the romance was near perfect. I liked the slow burn and the will-they-or-won't-they drama. I did feel, however, the ending was rushed and would have liked a few more pages fleshing that out. Overall, I really enjoyed this quick read and will look for the first in the series.
